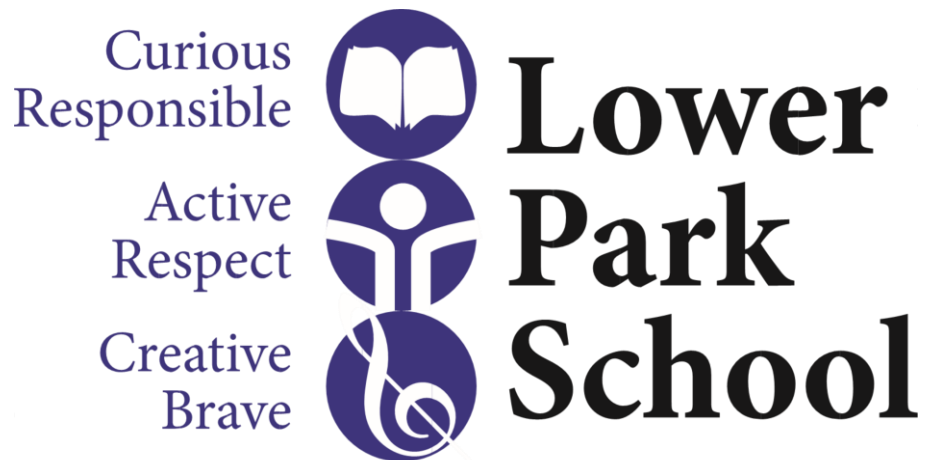

Reception

The children in Reception have been enjoying their 'Forest Friday' sessions in the wild area at the end of our school field. Together we have been using our senses to explore natural materials and compare their sizes and shapes. We have been listening carefully for all sounds around us that we can hear. Every session begins and ends with a special forest school song, which the children have picked up very quickly.











KS1

This week in KS1 the children have enjoyed their learning in maths. The children are becoming really familiar with Power Maths and are enjoying working independently in their work books. The children in year 1 have been looking at addition within 10 using the part whole model and number lines. In year 2 the children have been counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and they have looked at fact families later on in the week. In RE, the children have been looking at ways we can look after our world. They talked about how it was important to recycle, look after animals, look after our environment and be kind to one another. In Geography the children recapped their learning on the 4 countries in the UK and enjoyed a 'fly over' of our capital city, London, where we recognised and discussed different landmarks.

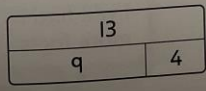

LKS2

Another busy week in LKS2. We've been learning more about the continent of Europe, this week focussing on the different climate zones. Climate is the study of the weather over a long period of time, looking for trends. Europe has many different types of climate experienced in the different countries. Ranging from polar with lots of snow, experienced in area of high latitude, to small areas which are classed as a desert, with hot days and cool nights. In PE we have continued to focus our efforts on ball skills, this week's challenges were focussing on our catching skills. The children had to see how many claps they could do before a successful catch. They then took this number of steps back to increase the distance. The winners were the pair who were stood the furthest apart after a set amount of time. We have also been thinking about Christmas this week! In art we have created our Christmas designs as these will be soon sent off to be turned into cards.















UKS2

We are continuing to follow the exciting journey of Matthew Henson in our text, Race to the Frozen North, and enjoyed incorporating drama into our English lesson this week. In small groups, we created freeze frames to capture things that might happen during the day whilst out on a dog sled to track a caribou or wolf. Then, we used a 'magic microphone' to share our thoughts and feelings in each scene and recorded our ideas on a story map.

We're excited to share that all our have been taking part in an exciting Zumba workshop as part of Mental Health Week. Some children will be joining the zumba group next week

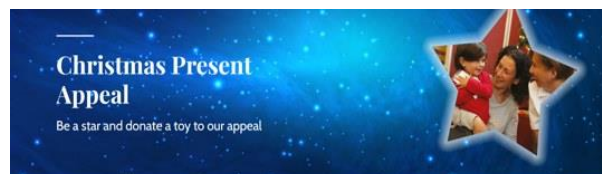
