#### Reception

In Reception, the children have been busy in maths lessons looking at numbers to 20. They confidently counted forwards and backwards from a given number and looked at one more and one less. They looked at using two tens frames to make numbers greater than 10. The children are really enjoying our text, 'Supertato' and this week they thought about what they would be like if they were a superhero. They came up with some great ideas about how they would save the day!

#### KS1

This week in KS1 we have enjoyed music lessons where we have been looking at pitch. We have been discussing whether we can hear high or low sounds. The children had a go at using a glockenspiel to make the different sounds. We have also had a very special visitor in school this week. In History we have been thinking about what school would have been like a long time ago. Margaret Martin, a former teacher at Lower Park, kindly came in to answer any questions the children had about life in school from around 40 years ago.













#### LKS2

It has been busy and messy in art lessons this week! The children have continued their work on nests which, as a result, has produced wonderful outcomes. We started by collecting items that birds typically use to make their nests with, then made our own paintbrushes using twine to secure the pieces in place. We then used our 'paintbrushes' to create marks with ink and once we were comfortable and happy with our practise, we painted birds' nests. The children thoroughly enjoyed experimenting with handmade tools and were happy with their finished piece.

In PSHE we have been learning about hazards in the home and how to stay safe in the event of a fire. We talked about calling 999 in an emergency and defined what an emergency is so we knew when it was the right time to call the emergency services.









#### UKS2

Over the past few weeks, the children have been diligently working on creating a booklet focused on a specific South American country of their choice. They have explored various aspects of their chosen country, including its national flag, geography, capital city, main industries, climate and notable tourist attractions. Through this work, the children have developed valuable skills in research, writing, and presentation. They have demonstrated curiosity and enthusiasm in learning about different cultures and countries. The culmination of their efforts will be the completion of these informative booklets, which show-cases their understanding and creativity in depicting their chosen South American nation.
