UKS2

In UKS2 we have been very busy with our learning this week. In English we have been looking at how our writing style can change depending on the audience. We have written postcards, imagining that we have visited Niagara, described the scene of the falls and examined the character of Annie Edson Taylor, the American schoolteacher who, on her 63rd birthday, became the first person to survive a trip over Niagara Falls in a barrel on the 24th of October 1901!




'See my books' Friday 11th October 9:00-9:20

Forest School started in Scandinavia and is a way of learning in a woodland environment. It provides the space where people can develop socially, emotionally and physically through play, following individual and preferred learning styles. Forest School gives children the time and space necessary to develop the tools and skills to become active, brave and curious learners. Please can we remind you that we are an Operation Encompass school. Amelia Lomas is the Key Adult and has been trained in Operation Encompass procedures.





Dear Parent/Carer,

Our school is part of Operation Encompass which is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and police forces.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced domestic abuse.

As a school we have ensured that a member of our staff, (Designated Safeguarding Lead) known as a Key Adult, has been trained in the Operation Encompass procedures allowing us to then use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to support the child/ren in our care.

The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 identifies children who experience domestic abuse as victims of domestic abuse in their own right.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.
