






KS1

It has been a very exciting week in KS1! We have started looking at the songs for our Christmas show performance, 'The Twinkly Nativity'. We have been practising all of the words and have starting learning some actions for some of the songs and dances that we will be performing. We are so excited to start rehearsing altogether in the coming weeks!



LKS2

Over the past few days, the children have thoroughly enjoyed their swimming lessons. They are putting in a lot of effort to improve their strokes. It has been wonderful to see their

determination and to hear how supportive they are of one another. The groups have been demonstrating fantastic teamwork, encouraging and cooperating with each other.

In science, the children have started a new unit of work exploring light and its importance in our daily lives. They've been investigating what darkness is, identifying various light sources, and learning how light enables us to see. These discussions have sparked curiosity, with the children asking insightful questions.






#### UKS2


In UKS2 we have begun to design our scratch platform games. After creating our stages we have now moved on to our sprites (characters). We have used the paint tools on the scratch platform to design characters which fit with the overall theme of our design and have downloaded copyright free images off the Pixabay site to make our computer games look more professional. Next week we will begin to write the algorithms for these sprites. In PE, all the children have been engaging in dance lessons this week. Creating their own dynamic body percussion routines inspired by the stimulus of three expressive words: swish, pop, and bang. Using their bodies as instruments, they explored the contrasting dynamics of these words, translating them into unique rhythms and movements. For swish, the children created flowing, sweeping gestures with soft claps or gentle foot slides. Pop encouraged sharp, staccato sounds like finger snaps or quick claps, whilst bang resulted in bold, explosive actions such as stomps or loud chest pats. This activity developed their understanding of musical dynamics, creativity, and collaboration.
