# Outdoor area exciting developments

We are excited to share our long term plans for the development of the outside area.

Phase 1 - development to the Early Years outdoor area and new buddy bench for all children (December 24/ January 25)

#### Phase 2 - development of new MUGA pitch (Summer 25)

Phase 3 - development of main playground including sensory tunnel and improved surface and markings (Autumn 25)

The PTA are currently fundraising for the multi surface pitch and a sensory tunnel. We are well on our way and fundraising activities like the Christmas Fair are vital.

## Academisation and Bromcom

We are still on track to officially join the Halliard Trust Academy on January 1st. Over the past month, they have been helping us transition from our previous data system with SIMS to a more modern platform called Bromcom. Those of you with children at Poynton High School may already be familiar with this system, as it is also used there, alongside an app called 'My Child at School.' This change will happen in phases, with the goal of providing a comprehensive 'one stop shop' for payments and communications by September 2025.

At this stage, there is nothing you need to do, but you may need to log in again to your existing apps (such as School Spider). For your reference, we've attached a list of frequently asked questions. Please note that no further action is required from you at this time.



#### MIS Migration Frequently Asked Questions

#### Parent Accounts

#### Will parents need to update their accounts?

Yes, this is a fresh upload of data meaning your parents will have new login details. This is due to your MIS switch creating new parental ID numbers for each account.

#### How do parents reset their account?

Parents will need to press the reset password link on the login screen. This can be accessed via the School Spider parent app and also via the parent portal. All they need to reset their account is their account is their

### Will parents be able to see previous messages, parents evenings, surveys and forms and payments?

Parents will not have access to these items as they are attached to their account from your previous MIS. Any email receipts will still be accessible in the parents email inbox.

The school will still have access to these items in the administration area.

#### Payments System

#### How will parents pay outstanding invoices?

Once the data is being extracted from your new MIS, parents will no longer have access to their outstanding invoices. We strongly recommend that parents settle any outstanding invoices prior to the MIS migration. If this is not possible, you will need to remove the outstanding invoices from the system and reissue these to the new parental accounts once the MIS migration is complete.

You can use the reporting area within the payments system to run a report on outstanding invoices.

#### Will parents be able to use their account balance?

Parents will not have access to their current account balance following the MIS migration completion

If parents are unable to spend their account balance prior to the migration, you can refund these back to their payment card in the parent profile



#### What happens with approved vouchers on parental accounts?

Parents will no longer have access to any vouchers uploaded in their current account after the migration.

We would recommend using the reporting area of the payments system to run a Vouchers Report. Any parents who have balance remaining on their voucher will need to upload a new voucher for the remainder once they are logged into their new account following the migration.

today! We will continue our learning in RE lessons, where we will answer the question, 'Why do Christians believe God gave Jesus to the world?'.
















## LKS2

For the evening show on **Thursday 12th December.** We would ask that participating children are returned to school by 6pm, so they can get changed into costumes, ready for a 6.30pm start.


## **Buddy Bench competition**
