




#### LKS2

In science, the children have been exploring shadows. They enjoyed looking at how to transform their hands into simple animal shadows. They learnt that shadows form when something blocks the light which their hands demonstrated perfectly.


As part of their investigations, they explored how different materials interact with light. They found that opaque objects create dark shadows by completely blocking the light, while transparent objects let nearly all the light through, making them important for uses like windows and glasses. Translucent objects, which allow some light to pass through, also sparked thoughtful discussions about their unique role in everyday life.

The children also identified the pattern that the distance of an object from the light source affects the size of the shadow. They cooperated in order to keep the investigation fair whilst carefully measuring the shadows created.




































#### UKS2





