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## Letter from the Governing Body

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*Dear Parents and Guardians,*

*You will recall that after a very exhaustive and demanding selection process, Governors agreed to seek to join the Halliard (formerly Fallibroome) Multi-Academy Trust. The school was able to complete the process on 1st January, so Governors feel it would be useful if we quickly reviewed our new exciting relationships with the Trust and their partner academy schools.*

*Even before the full transfer, we were able to join in a large range of development programmes for staff and our pupils. Governors were also able to access courses on the Curriculum, Ofsted, school data, risk management and the needs of SEND Students. We were also able to join in a number of governor development networks on H&S and SEND. Staff have also been able to access a very extensive staff development programme. This development activity and the Trust's rolling support with school improvement, help our teachers to provide the best learning for our children.*

*Parents will have seen that we have been transferring to new data system and a new 'My Child at School' app. The IT transfers seem to be working well. The Trust's back-office support has also been exceptional. Families have also been able to access support from Autism Central facilitated by the Trust.*

*But of course, our children are at the heart of everything we do and they have excelled themselves in the Trust's multi-school learning activities. We had an incredible Inspire creativity week generously supported by the Trust with our children being able to join in with other choirs, practice their samba routines, and tread the boards in their drama workshops. We even think*

*we may have a few budding Matisse's? The Year 6s also joined in a Sports hall athletics competition with other schools from the Trust.*

*In summary, therefore we are really pleased with how well our transfer has gone and the amazing opportunities for our students and staff and the great support we are receiving.*

Dear Parents and Carers,

**Re: Snack Trial Announcement**

The Eco Committee is excited to explore new ways to improve breaktime snacks, focusing on both health and sustainability. We'll be taking this journey step by step, gathering feedback from both the school council, staff and families along the way.

**Step 1: Snack Trial**

We've noticed that some children in Key Stage 1 are spending too much time in snack queues instead of enjoying their playtime. Additionally, some order multiple snacks, which can affect their appetite for lunch. To address these concerns, we want to make the snack process quicker and easier by moving towards cashless transactions. This will help save time, reduce stress, and make everything run more smoothly.

After reviewing popular snack choices, we found that bagels and juice are the top picks among Lower Park children. With this in mind, we're introducing a snack trial where families can pre-order snacks for a whole week or half term. Snacks will be delivered directly to classrooms, cutting down on queuing time. For Key Stage 2, this change will also free up more teaching time, as teachers will have less administrative work in the morning. Additionally, to support our commitment to healthy eating and sustainability, after Easter, every Monday children must choose a healthy snack (fruit, veg or snack shack)

**Trial Details**

The trial will begin on Tuesday April 22nd. Here are the snack prices:

- Full bagel daily (1 week) – £3
- Half bagel daily (1 week) – £1.50
- Juice daily (orange or apple, 1 week) – £2.25
- Choice of fruit daily (1 week) – £1.50

Snacks will be pre-ordered and paid for via the MCAS app using the shop feature.

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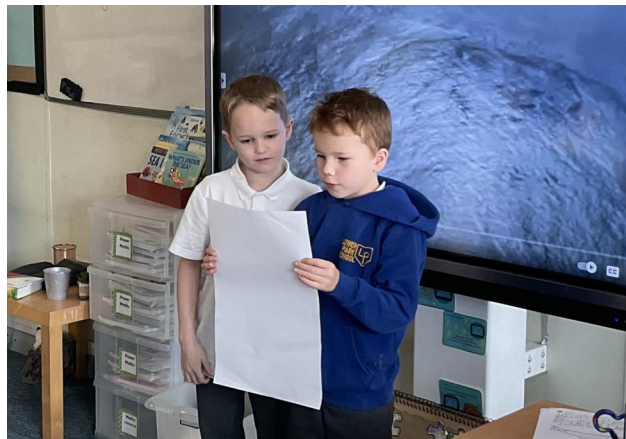


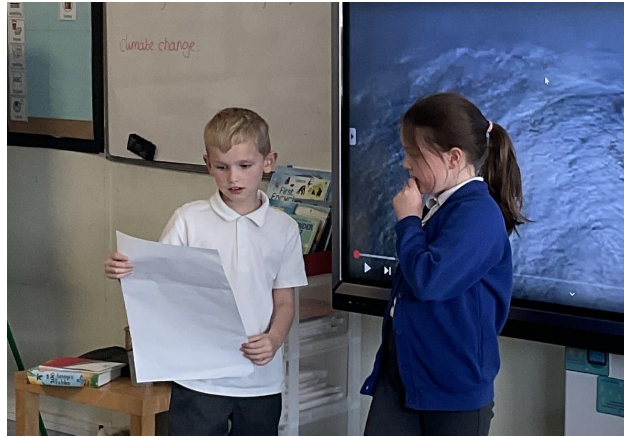
LKS2

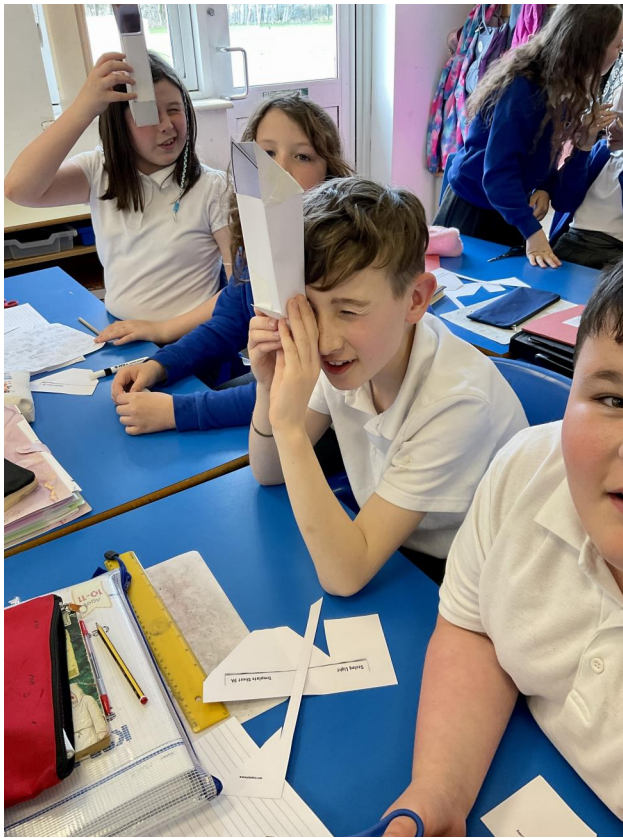

## DROP-IN WITH THE EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY TEAM



The Educational Psychology (EP) Service is offering parent/carer drop-in sessions at Cheshire East Family Hubs, held once per half term in both the North and South localities. These informal sessions are an opportunity to discuss concerns, seek advice, and explore strategies to support your child. They are not for Local Authority processes (e.g., EHCPs or placement changes) or child assessments.

### Examples of topics include:

- Concerns about speech development
- Managing challenging behaviours
- Social skills or play difficulties
- Anxiety or school-related issues
- Preparing for adulthood

Parents/carers can book a 30-minute slot by calling their Local Family Hub. Sessions will be themed based on age groups (e.g., Start for Life, Primary, Secondary/Post-16) to align with the Family Hub journey map. Afternoon sessions will coincide with the Little Stars stay-and-play group for children with SEN.
